Rescue

On-going Rehabilitation

Step-down Habitats & Life-term Care

- ♥ Construction & maintenance of large living enclosures for duration of stay until release
- ♥ Providing natural enriching environment that will promote physical development needed to survive in the wild
- ♥ Kennels, hammocks, bedding material & stuffed animals for overnight security
- ♥ Washing machines, laundry detergent, electric & water for daily laundry

Prevention

- ♥ Branch cutting
- ♥ Bridge building
- ♥ Purchase transformer insulator kits
- ♥ Insulation of electrical lines with ICE
- ♥ Stop the Shocks Project
 - ♥ Coordination & planning with ICE environmental engineer

Daily Operations

- ♥ Purchase, storage & preparation of food
- ♥ Vitamins, nutritional supplements & Isomil soy based infant formula
- ♥ Fuel & labor for daily leaf gathering
- ♥ Labor for facility & grounds keeping
- ♥ Maintenance & labor for greenhouse
 - ♥ Propagation & planting of trees & plants
 - ♥ Equipment, electric & water
- ♥ Purchase of tools & equipment for grounds maintenance
- ♥ Labor, supplies & equipment for daily habitat cleaning
